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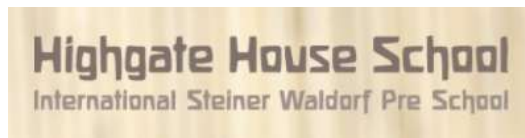

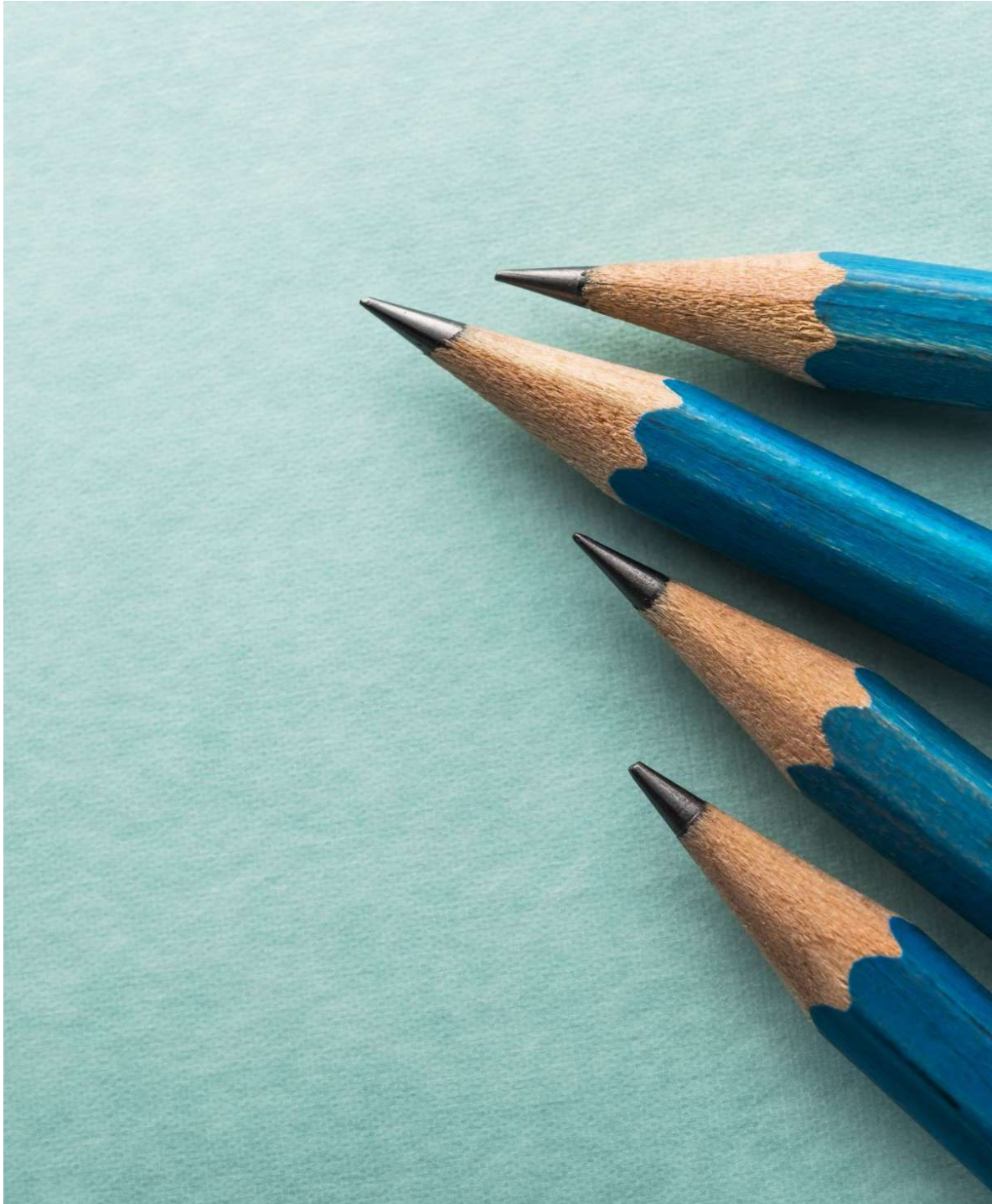

We specialize in services for children with weak social skills and social thinking, language delay, behavioral challenges, <i>Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD)</i> , <i>Global Developmental Delay</i> , <i>ADHD</i> , and those who are weak in social and language development.
Approach :	<p>Kids Connect adopts an interactive approach in our specialized program of SPARK, where the children are immersed in our group time, partner time, and one-on-one time in every session. The combinations of multiple learning formats allow the children to develop a variety of skills in different settings, which facilitate skills application and generalization. In addition to classroom-based learning, Kids Connect also offers regular field trips, community activities, festival celebrations and seasonal parties to develop children's skills outside of their regular routine and curriculum.</p> <p>In our SPARK Program, assessment is performed to understand the child's strengths and challenges. A personalized program will then be created to leverage on the child's relative strengths to optimize the child's learning in the challenging areas. Kids Connect places a strong emphasis on the development of play, social and language skills while simultaneously focus on the development of attention and executive functioning skills. We aim for the children to make meaningful and significant progress with our dynamic and innovative practice.</p>

Target :	SEN primary aged children, who require significant additional preparation to potentially enter mainstream education, and also those with higher needs who require a specialist long-term provision for their primary phase of education. Children may have a variety of different special educational needs, for example, moderate learning difficulties that include: Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD), Speech and Language disorders/ communication difficulties, Global Developmental Delay, Cerebral Palsy, Hearing and Vision Impairment, Physical Challenges.
Curriculum / Approach :	In addition to an adapted British National Curriculum, SBKY provides an intensive, personalised learning environment and a highly individualised curriculum, delivered in tandem with a therapeutic provision (e.g. Speech and Language Therapy and Occupational Therapy input). Focus on academic development in tandem with the development of important life skills for successful preparation for adulthood. We encourage children to become increasingly independent in their self-help, organisational skills, generating their own ideas and exploring their own creativity. The site is set within a peaceful village location, offering ample opportunity for outdoor learning and community inclusion, for real-life, hand-on educational experiences.

Curriculum / Approach :	An authentic inclusion model is provided: all students are included as much as possible with their neurotypical peers as we recognize that there are mutual benefits for both neurodiverse and neurotypical children learning from, and with, one another.
Therapy services	Full time employed Speech and Language Therapist and Occupational Therapist who work collaboratively with teachers. The therapists provide therapy in one to one, small group and in-class settings.
Levels of support:	Mild, moderate, and intensive
Classes and Services :	Our students are integrated into mainstream classrooms with the appropriate level of support. When appropriate, children also receive small group or 1:1 instruction to develop specific skills. We recognize that children have different pathways to individual excellence and in the Secondary School provide a modified program for children with intensive developmental challenges. These students access typical classes where appropriate, and for core subjects such as English and Mathematics learn through the ASDAN curriculum framework. Older students can enrol in our Vocational program that prepares students for life after HKA through life skills and vocational training.
Capacity	We aim to have no more than 15% of the student body accessing Learner Support
Staffing :	We strongly believe in all teachers for all learners, so all teachers work with students who access Learner Support. Through both PS and SS divisions we have nine learner support teachers and sixteen learner support co-teachers.

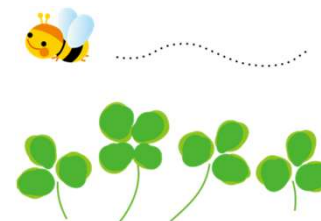

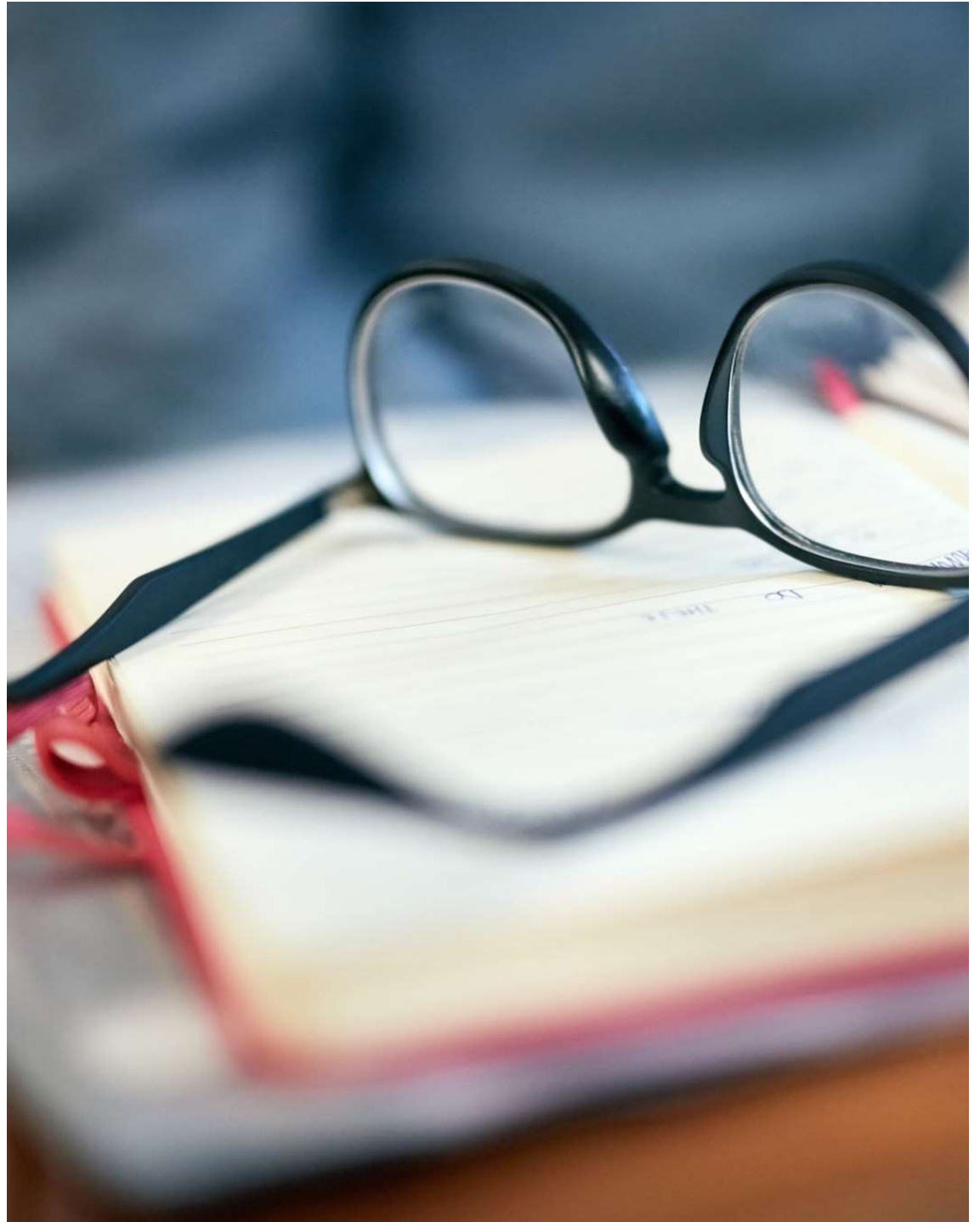

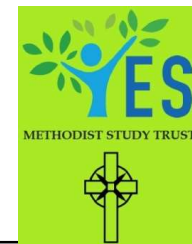
